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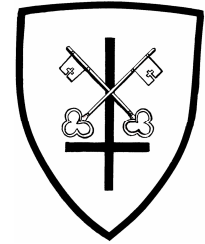
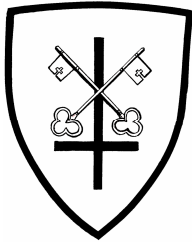

### FROM THE ASSISTANT RECTOR

### DATES TO NOTE:

Dear Friends,

What wonderful things this parish can do when we pull together! Our Wild Willy Lenten program is foremost on my mind right now, since I am immersed in it up to the hairs on top of my head. This has truly been a group effort. We've had eight teenagers and twenty adults actively involved in leading the program each week. A huge, creative program has resulted from everyone doing his/her part. The children who have been participating have been fantastic—full of energy, fully engaged and well-behaved. It has been great to watch the parents have fun participating with their children.

I've made some important observations about our parish during the course of this program. One: We love acting! People readily volunteered to play roles. Once assigned, the actors really got into their characters, got creative, and all did a fabulous job at performance time. Two: When you turn people loose to use their gifts, amazing things occur. From the creation of the candy factory...to the characters in their roles...to specially written words to music...to leadership in the classroom...whenever people are using their gifts, magic happens. Three: When people are using their gifts, they enjoy what they are doing and because they are enjoying it, they make time for it. Four: People come to church, even on beautiful sunny days, when they are having a good time. Five: We can learn while we have fun.

Sometimes we are asked to do something that fits our gifts, but we feel overwhelmed and we say no. It's the initial hurdle that's hard to get past. For example, let's say we are creative and we know it, but we can't see how we'll find the time. Or, we know we are a leader, but we are afraid to assume more responsibility because we are so busy now. Or we have a great idea for a program at St. Peter's...if only someone else would do it. The biggest hurdle is the first. It's like stepping off the diving board. After we are in the water, swimming is easy.

God will give us all we need. We will find the time. We will find the ability. We will find the courage. God gave each of us gifts to use to bring about God's kingdom. That may be doing something big, like starting and leading a new program or mission trip, or it may be something smaller like making someone laugh. The thing God did NOT do is only give gifts to some people or only plan on a few people doing God's work. It is up to each of us to use what God has so generously given us. St. Peter's can do so much and be so much if every person contributes his/her gifts.

The time to make St. Peter's what we wish it to become is now. The time to do God's work in the world is now. We will always have too many demands on our schedules. Don't fool yourself into thinking, "I'll do it later, when..." because the when will never come.

### CHRISTMAS IN APRIL/REBUILDING TOGETHER 2010

Beginning in 1989, on a Saturday in April, St. Peter's parishioners have gathered, rain or shine, at the home of an Arlingtonian to paint, clear, clean and repair that home so the owner can remain in it in comfort and safety. This year our homeowner, Greg Boland, is a 94-year-old widower who delivered mail in the 22207 ZIP code until he retired. He's sharp as a tack, delightful, and gets around on his own, but can't keep up with the demands of house and yard work. Our job is simple: make his home livable.

Because Shrine Mont is the last weekend in April, we will be working the weekend before so that there won't be any conflict. There's enough to do so that another parish, Centreville United Methodist Church, will be working on the house the following weekend. Mr. Boland has many friends in the local area (no children, however) and welcomes our help.

**WHEN:** Saturday, April 17, 2010, from 8 a.m. until we're done (usually about 3:30 p.m.)  
Come as early as you can, stay as long as you can.

**WHERE:** 3700 North 17th Street, Arlington. Turn on Nelson Street off Lee Highway (across from the Cherrydale Safeway) and continue until it dead-ends at I-66.

**LUNCH:** Served on site

**WHAT:** Our 94-year-old homeowner has lived in this home since 1940 (it was built in 1926). He has quite a collection of bric-a-brac from auctions (even two 1952 Plymouth cars) and such. But it's time for that to go. We're considering a yard sale since some of it is in excellent condition and just needs a new home. Among the tasks identified for our team: Repair and clean the front and back porch, scrape the windows (carefully) and make the home more energy efficient, replace (as necessary) and paint exterior trim, repair gutters, caulk windows, clean kitchen, replace sink, gut the first-floor bathroom (Centreville UMC to join us in working on the kitchen and bathroom), remove interior obstacles, clean yard (it's big)—and restore the exterior charm to add to that of the neighborhood.

**EQUIPMENT:** Bring work gloves. If you have garden tools and want to work outside, bring them (and mark them so you'll know they are yours). No one needs to be told to wear old clothes. We'll have everything else.

**CAN YOU HELP?** As our veterans know, no skills required. We encourage our youth to participate but ask that those under the age of 16 be accompanied by an adult.

The Rebuilding Together Program is part of a nationwide effort. In 1988, the program did nine homes. Since then, more than 1600 homes have received volunteers' attention in Arlington, Fairfax and Falls Church. Other local programs operate in Alexandria, the District of Columbia and Montgomery County, Maryland. A drive for men's walking food and toiletries will be held in June, in honor of Father's Day.

## VESTRY NEWS —

### Vestry Highlights March 15, 2010

#### At its March 15 meeting, St. Peter's vestry:

- Voted to approve an answer to the auditor's report on the 2006 and 2007 books. To implement its answer, the vestry voted to require the Finance Committee to report its plan to meet the auditor's recommendations on Property, Plant and Equipment by June 2010 and to make a report on pledges at the mid-year review.
- Voted a resolution of appreciation for Roger V. for his contributions to St. Peter's audits.
- Voted a revised resolution of appreciation for Mira B. for her contributions as St. Peter's Treasurer.
- Voted to reemphasize its commitment to a building process through announcements, an Adult Forum, a Front Porch session at Shrine Mont, and all of St. Peter's available media.
- Approved a revised and reorganized version of the Vestry Norms.
- Elected Jack S., Allen B. and Larry S. as voting Lay Delegates for Diocesan Council.
- Approved the 2009 annual Parish Report

## VESTRY REPORT ON BUILDING ISSUES

The vestry continued the work begun during its annual retreat at a meeting on February 20, focusing on its next steps after receiving the Planning Team's report. The vestry is most appreciative of the work done by members of that team, including Gretchen G., Charlie M., Karen S., Chris S., John D. and Jack S., and thanks them for their efforts.

The vestry has reviewed the Planning Team's report along with the parish's Mission and Vision Statements and has identified areas where our physical plant is impeding our ability to attain our vision. For example,

"We the people of St. Peter's believe God is calling us to:"

- "Strengthen our spiritual foundation so that people can deepen their knowledge of God and advance their spiritual journeys" ... *but*
  - *Before and after services there is no place for someone to have spiritual quiet time.*
  - *Christian Formation activities and worship services regularly compete for the same space at the same time.*

## VESTRY NEWS (CONT.) —

- “Welcome all who come to St. Peter’s and help them find a place to nourish community where they can grow in faith and serve God” ... *but*
  - *The narthex between services is so crowded that people no longer feel welcomed.*
  - *Persons with disabilities cannot gain access to all facilities.*
  - *Fellowship activities and worship services regularly compete for the same space at the same time.*
- “Be welcoming and creative in our programs for youth and children, recognizing that they are the future and lifeblood of the church” ... *but*
  - *Classrooms for Sunday school are overcrowded.*
- “Be more intentional stewards through a focused commitment of time, talent, and treasure” ... *but*
  - *We have an aging heating system and other aspects of our building that are in dire need of an upgrade.*
- “Retain and nurture a strong, supporting, and well-balanced clergy” ... *but*
  - *Clergy offices are cramped and prone to flooding.*
  - *Clergy cannot spiritually prepare for services in a quiet place.*

The Vestry reached consensus that there are problems that prevent the parish from fully realizing its Mission and Vision Statements and, to the extent that they can be best solved by expansion or renovation, it fully supports efforts at expansion and renovation. The problems these efforts address should be identified by reference to the St. Peter’s Mission and Vision Statements.

While St. Peter’s is not bricks and mortar but a congregation in Christ, the vestry believes that our building and facilities form our church home, a vessel for grace, love, joy, grief and fellowship. For these reasons, the Vestry has decided to create a Building Committee. A nominating committee, established in December by the Vestry, met on February 23 to begin the work of forming the Building Committee.

The vestry charges the Building Committee first with delivering a Programs Needs Report (a requirements-type document) that should provide specific recommendations for each building issue as to whether it would best be addressed through more efficient use of existing facilities, renovation of existing facilities, expansion, or other means. The vestry asks the committee to report back within 30 days of its formation with an estimate of the timeline and costs associated with producing this report. Depending on the committee’s findings, there will be a number of following steps but this is the first. The vestry is responsible for acting on the committee’s findings and recommendations.

In addition to primary problems above, the vestry also reached consensus on the following guidance to the Building Committee—

1. Maximizing efficiency, in space and energy and resources, should be a high priority;
2. Maintaining the church’s character is a key consideration;
3. The future needs of the parish must be carefully evaluated in the Report; and,
4. The Committee should keep the vestry apprised of its work on a regular basis.

The vestry also discussed steps that can be pursued parallel with the Building Committee including evaluating consulting services associated with capital campaign efforts.

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Adult Forum sessions on Sundays at 10 A.M. are designed to serve our community by stimulating our thinking and actions in the Christian faith, exploring timely issues in our church and the world, and as an occasion for discussion about the ongoing activities in missions, worship, education and stewardship at St. Peter's. Topics range from aspects of our faith and worship, to books of the Bible, figures in Christian history, ethical dilemmas and contemporary issues of interest to our community. Discussion leaders come from within our parish community or sometimes are specially invited outside guest speakers, and we try to have two complementary forums to choose from each Sunday. 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**MUSIC AT ST. PETER'S —**

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**Christ the Lord Is Risen Today**

1739

*And if Christ is not risen, then our preaching is empty and your faith is also empty. 1 Corinthians 15:14*

John and Charles Wesley soon found themselves out of favor with many fellow Anglican ministers who spurned their fiery evangelistic preaching. Many pulpits were closed to them.

A friend from his Oxford days, George Whitefield, 22, who was having the same trouble, began preaching in the open air. In London, he asked Charles to stand with him as he preached to thousands in the open air in Blackheath, and Charles, too, got a vision for reaching the multitudes.

He made his first attempt on the outskirts of London. "Franklyn, a farmer, invited me to preach in his field," he wrote. "I did so to about 500. I returned to the house rejoicing." Soon he was preaching to thousands. "My load was gone, and all my doubts and scruples. God shone on my path; and I knew this was His will concerning me."

A man named Joseph Williams heard Charles in Bristol: "I found him standing on a table-board, in an erect position....He then preached about half an hour in such a manner as I have scarce ever heard any man preach...I think I never heard any man labor so earnestly to convince his learners they were all by nature in a sinful, lost, undone, damnable state; that notwithstanding, there was a possibility of their salvation, through faith in Christ....All this he backed up with many texts of Scripture, which he explained and illustrated, and then by a variety of the most forcible motives, arguments, and expostulations, did he invite, quicken, and labor, if it were possible, to compel all, and every of his hearers, to believe in Christ for salvation."

Charles Wesley still preaches today in much the same way through his ageless hymns, which are sung around the world each Sunday. Perhaps his most exuberant anthem is the one he simply called, "Hymn for Easter Day," published in 1739. It originally consisted of eleven stanzas. The "alleluias" were added later, but appropriately, for this is a hymn one never gets tired of singing:

*Christ, the Lord, is risen today, Alleluia!*

*Sons of men and angels say, Alleluia!*

*Raise your joys and triumph high, Alleluia!*

*Sing, ye heavens, and earth, reply, Alleluia!*
